


Komenda, Sherrye Eaton, prospective members Lissa Hilsee and Jenn Leary and myself.

The Delaware Service held at the Washington Memorial Chapel located at Valley Forge was held November 13.

"The Memorial Chapel and a modest bell tower were originally dedicated in 1926 in order to observe the 150th anniversary of the American Revolution. In the beginning, it was a mere

wooden tower that housed the "Star Spangled Banner National Peace Chime" of 13 bells representing each of the 13 original colonies. Though expanded over time to add more bells, the unstable wooden structure had to be demolished by 1953.

Our presentation will be by Debbie Duay "I Know It's There, But I Just Can't Find It! - Debbie's "Secret" Search Strategies." This presentation covers key strategies for effectively searching FamilySearch and Ancestry.com.

I had invited Debbie to speak to us via Zoom, but as she is now the Florida State Regent, she had to decline but invited me to feel free to share one of her workshop videos.

Debbie Duay received her Ph.D. in Adult Education from Florida Atlantic University (FAU) in 2007. She has over 20 years of experience in genealogy, and she has taught numerous workshops throughout the United States on researching early American ancestry.

Debbie is the Florida State Society DAR State Regent. She also serves as the National Vice Chairman for French Canadian Specialty Research. Debbie has served as the State Vice Regent, State Second Vice Regent, State Organizing Secretary, State Chairman of the Chapter Development and Revitalization Commission. State Chairman of the Lineage Research Committee, and State Chairman of the Volunteer Genealogists Committee. Her husband, Ted Duay, is a past President of the Florida Society Sons of the American Revolution. Through Debbie's research skills, her husband has proven his descent from 41 Revolutionary War patriots, a Mayflower passenger, a Jamestowne ancestor, King Edward I of England, and Charlemagne.

Debbie has helped over 450 people join the DAR, and her websites receive more than 250 visitors each day.
